

The Minor Prophets

• Chapter 1 ended with Jonah being swallowed by a great fish. The popular idea that Jonah went straight from the deck of the ship into the fish's open mouth has no support from either the narrative or Jonah's prayer. He was probably half-drowned before he was swallowed. If he was still conscious, sheer dread would have caused him to faint—there is no mention of the fish in his prayer. He can hardly have known what caused the change from wet darkness to an even greater dry darkness. When he did regain consciousness, it would have taken some time to realize that the all-enveloping darkness was not that of Sheol but of a mysterious safety. (Expositor's Commentary)

The Minor Prophets

- Jonah 2:2 "I called out to the Lord, out of my distress"
- Take note, at least from what is written for us, that Jonah makes no specific request of the Lord he is in such distress that he just cries out to the Lord.
- The man was in the belly of a fish it would have been dark, smelly, his skin is being eaten through by digestive juices, and it's probably the world's worst place to experience motion sickness.

The Minor Prophets

- You can imagine the credibility that Jonah had when he arrives via the gut of a giant fish. (the Ninevites may have thought their god Dagon, literally a fish, sent him)
- God gives Jonah a second chance to obey Jonah 3:1 <u>Then</u> the Lord spoke to Jonah a second time: 2 "Get up and go to the great city of Nineveh, and deliver the message I have given you."
- I cannot promise that if God calls you to do something, that you will always get a second chance, but Jonah's experience tells us it is more than a remote possibility.

The Minor Prophets

- Jonah 3:4 Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's journey. And he called out, "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" 5 And the people of Nineveh believed God. They called for a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them. ESV (and Jonah probably said, "wait, what?")
- Notice there is no fluffy appeal about how much God loves them, how he longs to fellowship with them, and he has a wonderful plan for their lives - actually Jonah makes no "sales pitch" whatsoever.

- The Holy Spirit had the people of Nineveh ready John 6:44 No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him.
- The Ninevites needed to hear they were lost and headed for hell they needed to know they are sinners and God's wrath is hanging over them.

Before we move on, I want to sow a seed – let's pay particular attention to what happened when the Holy Spirit had Nineveh ready to hear from God.

Maybe we should invest in our unsaved friends and relatives by praying for God to open their hearts to the gospel – then perhaps they will respond to the truth no matter the willingness or eloquence of the messenger.

What happened in the hearts of the Ninevites ought to cause us all to stand in awe of our God as he proves that "he is the Lord, and there is none else".

- What we see is a "turn or burn" message much like Jonathon Edwards preached in the Great Awakening.
- You could attend the average church in America for years, maybe decades, before you would hear a message on hell.

- "And the people of Nineveh believed God. They called for a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them".

- Jonah 3:6 The word reached the king of Nineveh, and he arose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. 7 And he issued a proclamation and published through Nineveh, "By the decree of the king and his nobles: Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste anything. Let them not feed or drink water, 8 but let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and let them call out mightily to God. Let everyone turn from his evil way and from the violence that is in his hands. 9 Who knows? God may turn and relent and turn from his fierce anger, so that we may not perish."
- Gospel preaching really can be one size fits all the elite and the "not so" elite, the young and the old, all have the same problem.

The Minor Prophets

- While we are not given the exact words Jonah said, we are given this "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!"
- Did he say more than that? Perhaps, but it is also true that when the Holy Spirit has someone prepared, they only need a "word".
- Romans 2 tells us the gospel is imprinted on our soul so maybe all they needed was just confirmation.

Romans 2:12 For all who have sinned without the law will also perish without the law, and all who have sinned under the law will be judged by the law. 13 For it is not the hearers of the law who are righteous before God, but the doers of the law who will be justified. 14 For when Gentiles, who do not have the law, by nature do what the law requires, they are a law to themselves, even though they do not have the law. 15 They show that the work of the law is written on their hearts, while their conscience also bears witness, and their conflicting thoughts accuse or even excuse them 16 on that day when, according to my gospel, God judges the secrets of men by Christ Jesus.
